The Priest's Corner

Isn't Life a Series of 'Ins' and 'Outs'?

I had an appointment at 7 o'clock this morning in Lawrenceville, so down Greentree Hill I went into the Fort Pitt Tunnel and out of it. Then back in and out to pick Ken up for his doctor's appointment, and I found myself in the Fort Pitt Tunnel again and back out of it. The inward/outward repetition today tired me out a bit, frustrated me some, but got me thinking that so much of life is like that. We go in and out. People come into our lives and then go out ... and maybe come back in and go back out. Things come in and often to make room for them other things have to go out or you have to move stuff around to accompany the new incomers.

Is there value at all to this? I suppose it shows us how transitional a lot of life is. It challenges our "getting too comfortable" with stillness — which often I don't appreciate. I'd like more stability often times. Dilemma time! I just gave the following advice to a person recently: "You know, my friend, a stopped car is really hard to steer and turn. It's a lot easier to turn a moving car — even if it's just a slow movement. Remain moving in a direction. You don't have to go fast, just don't quit moving toward your hope because if you do, it will be hard to make the turn when the inevitable crossroads are in front of you." I suppose this is what resilience and flexibility is all about.

So, my dear Brendanites, you will notice a large, 6' x 7' grand piano entered our church while you were doing your week. An anonymous donor wanted us to have this outstanding musical masterpiece. Knowing very little about instruments of this caliber, I asked our incoming music director to visit the grand, discuss it with the owners and experience it. With the help of his knowledgeable connections and the donors, he encouraged us to receive this treasure as it is not only an outstanding instrument, but also holds the potential to provide us with musical uplift for decades. In the words of our new music director: "The piano is an 'artist level' instrument — a quantum leap above any of our current pianos. This is one of the finest pianos made and it is in pristine condition. There is absolutely no maintenance necessary beyond regular tunings. The piano will last for decades, and it will put St. Brendan's on the map as a serious place for music. Its glorious tones will certainly enhance our Sunday worship. With this fine instrument, we will be able to present special music performances in our church."

In case you have not heard, we have hired Daniel May, and he will take his post as music director on February 2. He is meeting with the choir and musicians, singers and instrumentalists at St. Brendan's. Here's some personal information Daniel shared: "My family attended St. Brendan's years ago. During that time, I directed the children's choir (called the "Musical Maniacs"). It was a great experience. I have many ideas about how we can keep and expand music as a vital part of our worship together."

Here are some of Daniel's thoughts going forward: "I see the future of our music at St. Brendan's as a balance of traditional and contemporary music. Traditional hymns and organ will remain an essential part of our service. I also want to establish a small group of instrumentalists that can play more contemporary, less traditional worship music. Sometimes I want to blur the lines between strictly traditional and contemporary. For example, it may often be appropriate for the band to accompany the choir. Spirituals, folk music and new music will be a part of my plan. I will encourage greater participation from the congregation, including a thriving bell choir and, of course, the children of St. Brendan's. I want to try new approaches and, with your patience and cooperation, I am confident that we will together find a balance that works best."

Daniel recently worked in a church about 30 miles from here; I was impressed that he regularly sought hymn choices from people in the congregation. So let him know some of the hymns you'd like to experience at St. Brendan's.

Daniel and our current friend and organist, Erica Lin, have a professional and personal relationship that goes back more than a decade. Daniel is an accomplished organist as well as reputable music director. Our music directors of the past were accomplished directors but did not play the organ. Most recently, Erica played the organ and piano because the director did not. When we were considering Daniel as music director, we involved Erica in the process. She encouraged us to continue to work toward getting Daniel on board while understanding that he would be playing the organ if it worked out that he became director. St. Brendan's and Erica have been in a personal and professional relationship for over 18 years. Both she and we have great love for each other. When we both realized that the future might not include Erica as the weekly organist, we met several times to draft a way we could continue our relationship in a new way. The vestry became involved in a mutually satisfying financial arrangement and others worked to help Erica with growing her private tutoring business and connect her skills with our diocese as a whole. Erica has free access to our church and appropriate instruments to conduct tutoring sessions and recitals. Both Erica and we are very satisfied with our results and the loving, caring handling of this aspect of our process. We want to honor and thank Erica for her years of service and love of St. Brendan's at our Annual Meeting on January 26.

Oh, the "ins" and "outs" of life! Growth demands them, but hearts sometimes ache because of them. But then comes rejoicing and a tear or two as we make our way on this spiritual journey of life. God bless us all.

Parish Notes.

At Monday night's meeting St. Brendan's Vestry:

- Approved a 2020 operating budget for the parish with \$258,177 in spending and an anticipated year-end surplus of \$9,772. The 2019 budget year finished with a surplus of \$19,551, which was deposited in a reserve account.
- * Agreed to replace a faltering furnace at a cost of \$3,446.
- Issued support for the Justice Ministry's anti-gun violence project and its application for diocesan funding to demonstrate, through an outdoor t-shirt display, the number of recent gun victims in Allegheny County.
- Learned from vestry member Tim Austin that the diocese has awarded St. Brendan's a \$14,363 grant to be spent on security upgrades. Before that funding is used, Tim will apply for another security grant from at least one other source.

DID YOU KNOW?

You may already know that our baptismal font came from England, smuggled into the U.S. as a piece of heavy mining equipment by Bob Affleck, arriving a mere two weeks before the consecration of our first building. You probably know that the bowl is from the 12th century and the Victorian plinth, or base, was added in the 19th century. You may even know that Sylvia Affleck's brother, Peter, an English choirmaster, found it stored in a barn. It was from St. Mary's, East Stoke, Dorset, a deconsecrated church in a down-sized

diocese. BUT **did you know** that Pat Carnahan, our founding rector, had to write a letter assuring the Diocese of Salisbury that it would NOT be used in devil worship? East Stoke was not far from Stonehenge and "druid country."

We already have, undoubtedly, the oldest baptismal font in the USA, but our parish descendants 100 years from now will be able to celebrate its 1,000th anniversary.

The next CRIS meeting will be **THIS Sunday, January 19.** All are welcome.



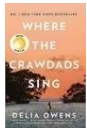

Our bishop, the Right Reverend Dorsey McConnell, has announced his retirement date in 2021. In discussions with the bishop, the Standing Committee has revised the schedule for the election and consecration of the ninth bishop of Pittsburgh.

January 23, 2021: Special convention to elect the next bishop

February 13, 2021: Snow date for the election, if needed

June 5 or 12, 2021: Consecration of the ninth bishop of Pittsburgh

The Standing Committee of the diocese will appoint a Nominating Committee to search for candidates and present them for final approval by the Standing Committee and ultimately election at the special convention. At this time, we ask that you recommend to us the names of any individuals who could capably serve on the Nominating Committee.

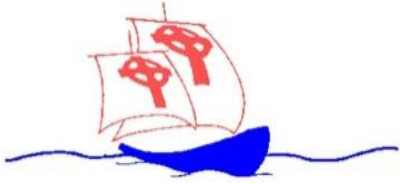
