## The Priest's Corner

### Time for a Retreat?

Have you ever been on a spiritual retreat? Well! Your opportunity to try one is here. Mark your calendars: JUNE 1, 2019 at St. Brendan's from 9:00am to 4:00pm.

"Retreat" comes from the Latin verb "to pull back." A retreat is a place and time where you "pull back" from the world--time away for you to get more in touch with God and yourself.

Retreats help you rest and slow down to create space. You get to detox from painful stressors. You get to withdraw from your regular life and enter a place where you get a new view or perspective as you regroup and re-energize. You find inspiration, which translates as "to breathe into." You breathe life into your life. How it comes is different for everyone, but one thing's for sure: inspiration won't strike out of nowhere, while you blindly do the same rote stuff every day. It's a frame of mind that can come from a change of landscape and outlook.

You leave a retreat lightened, clearer, recharged, refreshed, and more present. You go back home and re-establish your life in a new way.

You might recall during Lent St. Brendan's focused on the life-giving, mindfulness spirituality that the Reverend Richard Rohr has renewed for the church. Our June 1 retreat is focusing on one dimension of this spirituality known as the "enneagram."

Enneagram is a means of understanding nine distinct but interconnected personality types that have sacred implications in our spirituality and spiritual practices. Learning your type(s) helps you to pray, worship and meditate better and more comfortably because you learn your unique spiritual personality and fit spiritual practices accordingly. Not everyone prays the same way—and that's the way it should be. You will become so much more self-aware through this meaningful retreat.

During our upcoming retreat on June 1, A CONTEMPLATIVE EXPLORATION OF THE ENNEAGRAM: A GUIDE TO SELF-UNDERSTANDING AND LOVE, you will gain tools for personal growth and development with personal insight into our deepest motivations, fears and desires.

The workshop will include teaching, contemplative practices and exercises for exploring the enneagram.

Our two retreat leaders, when in Pittsburgh, have been participating at St. Brendan's for nearly a year:

### **Maria Hooper, MD**

Maria is a primary care physician who is, believes in, and works for whole person health and wellness. She trained in internal medicine at UPMC and has practiced medicine for over 25 years. She has also trained under Richard Rohr and attended the Living School at the Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, NM. She has completed the enneagram teacher training under Russ Hudson at the Enneagram Institute in NY. She is currently in a Mindfulness/Meditation Teacher Training under Tara Brach and Jack Kornfield.

### **Timothy St. Onge, PsyD, PhD**

Tim has been a professional counselor in private practice, spiritual mentor, and educator on the secondary, adult and college levels for forty years. For the last sixteen years, he has devised and cultivated a home based open meditation forum in Southbury, Connecticut, meeting five times weekly and once a month for full day programs.

He has studied and practiced a variety of meditation methods including mindfulness, Centering Prayer and other eastern and western practices.

He has studied and practiced with world leaders and has led several workshops and retreats in the Christian Zen and Centering Prayer methods. His current research interests are in best practices for secular contemplative living, contemplative educational approaches, and meaning centered psychotherapy.

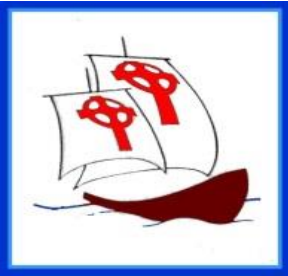
