## **Senior Warden's Corner**

Two Sundays ago at the 10 o'clock service, Mother Robin baptized Elowen Marie Struthers Thompson, the infant daughter of Annemarie Malbon and Daric Thompson. During the ceremony, the hearty throng of Brendanites who were there pledged to "do all in [their] power to support her in her life in Christ." It was a timely promise — not only for Elowen but for all children who are brought to St. Brendan's to be raised in the light of Christ's love and the rich soil of this Christian community.

Just the day before, St. Brendan's Vestry had held its annual daylong retreat to take stock of parish life and get organized for the year ahead. A key area of focus was the children and youth of St. Brendan's, the program that the church provides for them and the promises that we as adult members make to them. What a fortuitous moment that Elowen's baptism — and our vocal support for her — provided the next day.

After hearing at the retreat from leaders of our children's program about the needs of St. Brendan's young people, the vestry and Mother Robin committed themselves to finding new ways not just to support the Sunday School but to more broadly nurture the parish's youngest members as they grow into committed, thinking, active Christians. The most pressing need right now is, of course, more Sunday School teachers, but beyond that, there are other ways we can all help. For instance, could our ministries find a way to involve our young people in their projects and activities? Could our older members, at hospitality time, seek out young parents and their children for conversation (and vice versa)?

To increase awareness of our responsibility to raise up young Christians and to find more ways to keep that promise of support, three vestry members stepped forward to form a task force: Melanie Popovich, Frances Harpst and John Appeldorn. St. Brendan's will be hearing more from them in the weeks and months ahead. Till then, it is our duty as Brendanites to do all we can to raise the young members in our midst, answer their questions, and guide them toward rich, full lives in Christ. As Mother Robin has said, the children are not just the future of St. Brendan's, they are the present. They and their parents are the building blocks of our parish.

We made a promise this month to Elowen. Let's work on keeping that same promise we made to our other children on their baptism days.
