The Priest's Corner

What Are the Possibilities When Your Church Has a Social Justice Ministry?

More and more organizations, particularly churches, are opting to take a stand on social issues. Individual members are doing so as well by participating in boycotts, joining protests, signing petitions, writing letters and donating to causes or groups that they feel are in alignment with their values.

Many churches are trying to be proactive on this front and are mirroring some business practices to fit the ways of parishioners. For example, as organizations offer extra time off for specific activities like volunteering or performing charity work, churches can offer onsite child programs so family members can march, protest or do charitable works like the walk-in ministry at our Trinity Cathedral. As organizations are adding benefits related to social activism, churches are trying to incorporate similar replications of the business practice. These could take many forms. For example, businesses offer extra paid time off days when used specifically for social causes like protests, marches, attending government functions or rallies, meeting with legislators, attending events designed to shape public policy. Imitating this practice, churches could simulate this by having meals available, offering house sitting services, doggy day care, etc. to help people free themselves up for justice activities.

Company matching of donations for social causes, such as to a specific activist community or group that is in alignment with company values could be simulated by our church utilizing CRIES Advocacy to match our appropriate and church-aligned charitable donations. Companies have provided bail money for employees if they are arrested while legally protesting. We could have a funding source that could help with such needs, should they occur. Many companies provide information about local voting opportunities to encourage employees to take part. Our Social Justice Committee is planning a voter registration drive as its next activity.

More and more often, potential Brendanites are interested in where a church stands on social issues. This actually offers a great opportunity to attract newcomers. For example, almost three years ago we decided to put our immigration ministry on our website. The ministry was not as multifaceted back then as it is now. We had two or three mentees and one immigrant whom we accompanied to Immigration and Customs Enforcement hearings. There was an energetic, retired individual who passed by our church several times a week. He decided to visit our website one day. He learned that we had an immigration ministry and eventually got the courage up to call us. The call was directed to me, and I talked to him four times on the phone; he and his wife joined our church. These two were Jon and Mary DeMartino. Jon got busy immediately with our fledgling immigration ministry and, with the help of other interested parishioners, he took this ministry to a three-day and -night experience which has touched hundreds of people who needed help with learning English. This ministry keeps taking on new shapes even to this day.

By offering parishioners the opportunity to express their views, a church is taking a step toward becoming socially active regardless of whether the organization itself publicly supports a specific activity. Taking a stand makes the most sense in churches where there are specific social causes that are a good fit with the community's goals or that are a way to shape public

perception of the organization. We expect that every issue the Justice Committee endorses and takes action on will not match the views and energy levels of 100% of our members all the time. That would be humanly impossible and we don't expect unanimity on every issue. No one will ever be forced to participate in or support an issue they don't favor or understand. However, we are committed to guaranteeing that all suggested/chosen social justice issues align with St. Brendan's mission and vision statements. We likely will not have the means to endorse all matters of social justice. However, we invite all members of the church to make known to the committee the issues of justice that touch your hearts. If you want certain activities to be supported by the committee, please let us know. We now have a process for taking an individual's social justice concerns and move them through the process to hopefully get them into action mode by an arm of the committee and other interested church members.

Where the cause is a good fit for the church's goals and image, it can make a lot of sense to give parishioners that flexibility to be engaged and active in the things they care about. Never do we force members to participate. Our goal here is to follow the call of the Gospel which expects us to care for others as they need to be cared for – feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the imprisoned, as we pronounce the Day of the Lord and that indeed the Kingdom of God is at hand.

Fun Facts about the Brendan's Family and Friends (BFF) Fund

Did you know.....

- ~ The BFF fund began in 2017 as a way to honor St. Brendan's 30th birthday?
- ~ BFF funds are designated toward unbudgeted building needs.
- ~ A total of \$32,066 has been donated to BFF by generous family and friends of St. B's over the past two years.

Ways BFF funds have been used include:

- Restoration of the social hall sound system
- Purchase of sanctuary AV equipment including screen, camera, cart, accessories
- Installation of wireless transmitter to enable wireless video recordings
- Purchase of kitchen items – shelving, microwave, flatware, knives, etc.
- Installation of solar reduction film on windows in social hall
- Installation of security film on glass doors and some windows
- Replacement of an air conditioning unit
- Pending project – acoustic tile treatment of the social hall – over \$6,400 has been donated of the \$8,000 needed for this project.

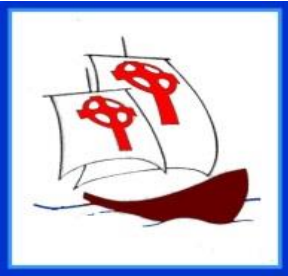
