## The Priest's Corner

### **Hi Parents, Grandparents and Anyone Connected to Children at Church.**

You might have noticed that things slow down a bit during the summer in the Episcopal Church. We are one of the churches that values vacations and believes God understands that, too.

So you'll see no formal choir or Sunday School or Children's Liturgy during the summer. At the same time, you'll see more creativity. I'll do some spontaneous things with the children from time to time depending on attendance. We still sing and you might witness us trying new things on that end — different instruments, music, and a YouTube, sing-along video from time to time.

We want you to still bring your children and use this time to help them sing with us, work as an usher, bring up the gifts, serve around the altar, etc. Let's be creative.

Some parents have asked if the nursery is available during the summer. Yes, the nursery is available! If you or your children need some space during the liturgy, feel free to take them to the nursery — just make sure that the numbers there are manageable for those who are staffing it. A few of you have already tried the 8 a.m. liturgy during the summer. You might want to drop in on that service, just to meet some new people and experience the liturgy there. It's always shorter than the 10 a.m. and matches it in energy and friendliness. Your children are very welcome there, too. It's easier for the kids to help me, if they want to, around the altar at that service.

Lastly, some parents were thinking of getting a few other parents to "take-a-Sunday-with-the-kids" on a rotating basis to play a game, watch a movie, tell a story, etc. during the service. Depending on how many parents volunteer, you might be on kids' duty once or twice during the summer. We need two parents at a time to be with the children for about a half-hour during the liturgy and sermon either downstairs or outside. When not on kids' duty, you'll be free to be in church without the need to watch after your little ones, thus giving yourself some space to personally engage in the liturgical experience undistracted.

We have two volunteers so far. We would need six to eight more to make this work. Everyone who volunteers to assist the children in this way will need to fulfill these clearance and safeguarding requirements.
