The Priest's Corner

What the Vestry Is and Why We Are Called the Episcopal Church

The Episcopal Church is the Church of England in the USA. You'll see the acronym TEC used, and it means The Episcopal Church. This terminology is used in some areas outside of the USA, but it's not the predominant term for the Church of England (COE) throughout the world. You might wonder then why we use the term Episcopal Church. A simple way to understand this peculiarity is that it distinguishes American COE churches from the worldwide Anglican Communion. (Anglican Communion is a term used to describe and collect all the worldwide churches flowing from the COE into a unity.) TEC and COE are under the same umbrella called Anglican Communion. The Anglican Communion is distinct from the Roman Catholic Communion or the United Methodist Confederation. England had a king or a queen; USA has always been a democracy. This structuring difference is implied in our distinct way of naming ourselves. TEC runs like a democracy; COE does not.

A simple way of understanding the implication of this distinction might be the following. An Episcopal diocese is like the United States; the parishes within the diocese are like the states. Just as you might notice some different cultures and "ways of being" among the states within our union; you'll notice some cultural and "ways of being" differences among parishes. This lends itself beautifully to our diversity mosaic as a diocese. We're together on major issues – i.e., women priests, same-sex marriage availability and so on; but one parish might be more progressive than another. You might have heard or noticed that St. Brendan's, the youngest church in the diocese, tends to be a bit more progressive and risk-taking than some of our other parishes.

Now, the term vestry originated in England and it literally was the room where ordained ministers vested, or dressed, for liturgy. While the dressing was going on, a great time to get the ear of the rector was afforded; thus, practical decisions got made in the vestry. The practice then gave rise to groups of laity gathering in that room to choose lay leaders, who then met to make decisions regarding the material running of the parish. When the notion of vestry moved into TEC, the work of the vestry settled around these three primary roles: 1) Care and management of parish finances, 2) Care and management of parish properties and buildings, 3) Choosing individuals to fill various positions of leadership and representation: the choice of a rector/priest-in-charge, the choice of delegates to the diocesan convention and the selection of others as the diocesan canons, or rules, may stipulate. The vestry also serves as an advisory council to the rector/priest-in-charge who by church law is the parish's chief liturgical and pastoral officer.

Vestry members are representatives of the people who come to St. Brendan's. All have access to every vestry member and are encouraged to share with vestry members their concerns and wishes for the good of the parish. All may attend vestry meetings, unless for some special reason a portion of the meeting needs to be closed for approved reasons. Ongoing, frequent and transparent communication among parishioners, vestry members and priest is a sign of a healthy parish.

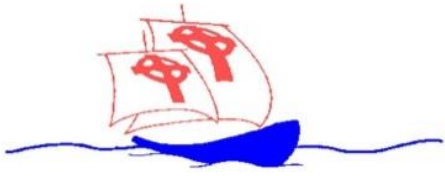
