## The Priest's Corner

**Welcome to Advent**—The Start of the New Liturgical Year A. What a Great Time to Renew!

Q: Is it true the 10 o'clock liturgy's climbing up to one and a half hours?

A: "Not in my church! Egads!"

I'm kidding, but, folks, it's true. Our 10 o'clock service recently has been getting close to it. Last Sunday, when we had to place our third and final stewardship sermon within the regular Children's Liturgy due to many factors, it was close to 11:35 a.m. when we ended the last hymn. THAT'S TOO LONG! We have to do something about this to keep the liturgy to under an hour and 15 minutes.

I polled a number of people at our church (20 or so) about a reasonably good amount of time for our 10 a.m. service, and the clear majority gave the time limit of an hour and 15 minutes; one said it didn't matter to her how long, and six said one hour. I asked five of my priest friends. They said not more than an hour and 15 minutes. I did some research on the Internet and this is typically what I found churches to say:

"On Sunday, the early service is about an hour, and the latter one is somewhat longer. Just like at a family meal, our focus isn't on the time, but the company! Some days we have a lot to share with God and each other." [www.cogsdunedin.com/how-long-will-the-service-last](http://www.cogsdunedin.com/how-long-will-the-service-last).

How about we shoot for the goal of one hour and 15 minutes? (If you have a strong opinion other than this, please let's talk — I want to hear your view.)

Here are two ideas I'd like to start immediately — first, assistance for the priests so that they begin the procession within seconds of 10 a.m. sharp and, second, a new approach to announcements. Here's my idea for starting at 10 a.m. pronto: I'd like to have the chime bell ring three times in the narthex seven minutes before the liturgy begins. This would be like the bell-ring warning at the symphony or a play at Heinz Hall.

What that would do is signal for all that it's seven minutes to liturgy. What it will do for me is give me closure to the conversation I'm usually engaged in as well as permission to leave, go into my office, shut the door and dress for liturgy. You know me — I'm

gregarious and get into conversations. I need a reminder to stop talking and a good way to more comfortably end communications. Some of you can just discipline yourself to do it; I need help.

The second idea is to eliminate spontaneous announcements. I don't know about you, but when I get a mic I can go on and on. It's just natural. Many are like me, and this keeps things going too long. So, the remedy, as I see it, is to have the vestry member of the day be the collector of these announcements and then give them en masse at one of three times during the liturgy. We can decide which time beginning not this Sunday, but next. We need some lead time to make this work.

So those with special announcements for the upcoming Sunday will notice in the Little Log the email address or texting contact for the vestry member of the day. If you have a special announcement to make (Now remember: generally if the announcement is already in the bulletin, there's no need to specially announce it in church.), send it in writing to the vestry members. If you miss the opportunity to send the announcement in before Sunday, the vestry member of the day will clearly be present in the narthex before liturgy. If you can't identify this person by name tag, ask for the person at the Welcome Table. Give your information to this vestry person. We can then experiment with three times for the vestry member to announce these special issues — right before the entrance procession takes place, after the Peace as a way of collecting the group again, or immediately before the dismissal. We can try each Sunday during Advent, then vote the best time to deliver these announcements beginning the first Sunday after Christmas.

There are other areas where we can trim back some time as well. I want to veer away from verses of hymns and the sermon for the time being. I'll share the reasons why next week. I'm open for other suggestions from you. Please let me or a vestry member know your ideas. I'd ask us all to be more mindful of the Peace and the amount of time we spend on it. I generally do a swipe approach, swiping through the sanctuary four different ways each week. For example, I'll go down the far right aisle by the choir, get to the back of the church and greet people as I continue back to the altar now through the middle aisle. I'm going to cut back a bit, just swipe up an aisle and return back to the altar the same way back. After all, I get to greet people after the liturgy and also in the social hall. One other area to cut down on time would be to have lay Eucharistic ministers, instead of the priest, take communion to people who are unable to walk to the front of the church as well as to those in the nursery. The distribution of communion has almost doubled over the last year and a half. This is a beautiful gift. A reality, though, is that it adds over 10 minutes more than we had only a short time ago. Perhaps we can think of ways to shorten the time here as well without cutting back on communicants.

Many of these time additives have to do with our gracious gift of increase and abundance. I would not trade this; we just need to apply stewardship management to it and create better methods in handling our growth.
