The Priest's Corner

Bishop Michael Curry in Wheeling October 5

When the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, was asked to comment on Prince Harry and Meghan Markle's choice of Presiding Bishop Michael Curry as the preacher for their royal wedding, he said, "Presiding Bishop Curry is a brilliant pastor, stunning preacher and someone with a great gift for sharing the good news of Jesus Christ." The newlyweds were thrilled by the bishop's words and style, the queen maintained a stiff upper lip, and the world became aware that day that we in ECUSA had an outstanding leader with universal appeal. I personally am so proud to say he is my go-to spiritual leader, role model, real-life hero, boss twice removed and huge inspiration.

Five facts about Presiding Bishop Michael Curry:

- 1. He helped save over 100,000 lives through a \$400,000 campaign to buy malaria nets through the efforts of the Episcopal Church's Millennium Development Union.
- 2. Bishop Curry is famous for a sermon about and called "Crazy Christians" and he speaks out on social causes.
- 3. He was born in Chicago and is the first black Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church.
- 4. He has urged Christians to become part of the "Jesus Movement" and was called to the faith by a dream.
- 5. His father led an all-black parish & our Presiding Bishop helped on Bobby Kennedy's campaign.

What is a PB (Presiding Bishop?) He/she is the chief pastor of the entire Episcopal Church in the USA. The PB is responsible for leadership in initiating, developing, and articulating policy and strategy. The PB oversees the administration of the national church staff and speaks for the church on issues of concern and interest. In addition, the PB is the president of the House of Bishops and is elected by the church's General Convention to serve a single nine-year term.

In the past, the Presiding Bishop was simply the senior diocesan bishop who presided over the House of Bishops. The role became an elected position in 1919, and in the 1940s it was decided the PB should resign any other jurisdictions for which he or she might have pastoral responsibility. Thus, this American office became different from that of many bishops in similar roles found in other churches in the Anglican Communion throughout the world. They have diocesan responsibilities in addition to overseeing a national church. In the 1970s, the PB was given authority to enter dioceses for sacramental and preaching ministry, consulting with bishops, and related purposes.

Throughout his ministry, Presiding Bishop Curry has been active in issues of social justice, reconciliation, speaking out on immigration policy and marriage equality. He served parishes in North Carolina, Ohio, and Maryland. He helped create the

Absalom Jones initiative, networks of family day care providers, and educational centers and he brokered the investment of millions of dollars in inner-city neighborhoods.

In 2018, Religion News Association named Presiding Bishop Curry the Religion Newsmaker of the Year.

On Saturday, October 5, a group of Brendanites are going to Wheeling, W.Va., to experience Bishop Curry. It only costs \$5 – a small donation. We are carpooling or driving ourselves. We are planning to have a nice dinner before we go to Wesbanco Arena to be with the PB. It will be a fun, uplifting, and an inspiring day. It's not too late to come along with us. I believe you will feel good for a very long time afterwards.

St. Brendan's Justice Ministry recommends how we can make a difference.

Numerous experts have said the key to real political change is to get more citizens to register and to get them to the polls to vote. We at St. Brendan's want to do our part.

In the entrance to the church you will find voter registration forms. They have the mailing address for Allegheny County. There are a few without the address for those who may not live in the county. Please affix a first-class stamp.

We are urging each parishioner to take three. When you are out to eat, ask your server if he or she is registered. Ask the clerk at the grocery store. Many service workers do not have the time to seek out a form and register. Ask your friends and neighbors, too.

If we all registered three people, we could make a real difference locally and even nationally. October 7 is the deadline to be registered for this year's November 5 election. Applications for an absentee ballot must be made by October 29.

YOU can make a difference. We also have opportunities to register new voters in the coming weeks:

Saturdays, September 21 and 28 and October 5, at Safran's market in Sewickley

Monday and Tuesday, September 23 and 24, at La Roche University.

Manageable shifts are available and training will be provided.
