The Senior Warden's Corner

You've heard the appeals. You've read the pitches in the Navigator's Log: "Would you like a way to acknowledge a special occasion like a baptism or a birthday or to remember a departed loved one? A donation to the Brendan's Family and Friend's fund is the perfect way to honor that special person or event." So St. Brendan's members respond with generosity from the heart and make contributions in memory of loving parents, to announce the joyful arrival of a new grandchild, to proclaim happiness over another year of marriage.

Our church is the beneficiary of these personal expressions because your donations to BFF are used, as the Navigator item also says, "for unbudgeted building needs." That purpose was served, big time, on Monday evening when St. Brendan's Vestry drew on the BFF fund for nearly \$8,000 for urgent needs that could not have been covered by the operating budget.

First was \$2,500 for a new AED (automated external defibrillator), a device that helps bystanders save an estimated 1,700 lives a year in cases of sudden cardiac arrest. It was the vigilance of parish security chief, Tim Austin, that revealed that our old defibrillator, mounted on the wall near the restrooms, is no longer functional and must be replaced. With BFF money, a new unit will be purchased to provide St. Brendan's members and visitors an extra margin of protection.

Then, during a routine inspection by our heating and cooling company, it was revealed that one of the church's furnaces was inoperable, just as the heating season was getting underway. Replacement cost: \$5,468. BFF to the rescue again, giving St. Brendan's the ability to buy a new furnace without blowing a hole through its day-to-day budget.

Yes, BFF funds have provided the parish with extras that it otherwise couldn't afford — amenities like the outdoor swing set for our children, acoustic panels to deaden the echo in the social hall, a retractable video screen and projector system, security window film, exterior painting. The list goes on, all made possible by your generous donations. But this week your tributes and remembrances were put to more fundamental use — to keep the heat flowing and, possibly, keep someone's heart pumping.

In so doing, you are truly St. Brendan's family and friends.
