This Monday (Jan. 9) was the last regular meeting of the 2022 Vestry term.

We discussed the ongoing roof project and commissioned a committee to oversee the funding of the project. The Vestry also appointed Ruth Horton to finish out the remaining year of Ron Ladick's term and Chris Botti to finish out the remaining year of Sean Sweeney's term. Each of these appointments will begin on January 22 with the start of the new vestry term.

The Vestry reviewed and approved the proposed 2023 budget, which will be put forth for final approval at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Finally, the Vestry has approved a final set of proposed amendments and changes to St. Brendan's bylaws. See blurb below.

It has been an honor serving as St. Brendan's Senior Warden over this past year. I want to thank the entire vestry for their service, passion, and dedication to the Parish over the past year. I especially want to thank the two vestry members with whom I started and am now ending my vestry term, Mary Bertucci and Donna Aiello.

Proposed amendments and changes to St. Brendan's bylaws.

As you may be aware, the last time our bylaws were revised was 14 years ago in 2009. Our parish has changed quite a lot since then and the Vestry agreed that it was time that the bylaws were revisited and updated.

The proposed revisions are included as a separate attachment to this email. These revisions will be included with both this and next weeks' Navigator's Logs and will be reviewed and voted on during this year's Annual Parish Meeting.

In the attached document, red text indicates substantive changes and wholly additional language; green text indicates non-substantive changes for clarification of existing bylaws and/or the addition of more inclusive language (e.g., changing "his or her" to "their"); and blue, strikethrough text indicates deletions or omissions (including original language where language has been revised).





Sunday School needs your help! We're very happy to see so many of our children participating in Sunday School at St. Brendan's, but we're short on teachers. No teaching experience or specialized training is required to become a teacher. All we ask is that you have an interest in our children and their religious education, and we will help with the rest.

We use a curriculum that lays out each lesson in a user-friendly way, and we have most of the supplies on hand that you would need. Lessons run 20-30 minutes and are taught at the beginning of the Sunday 10 am service. Children return to the service after announcements. We have two classes: Grades K-2 (the "Lambs") and Grades 3-5 (the "Fish").
