From the Senior Warden . . .

At last Sunday's well-attended, well-received Newcomers' Brunch, an inevitable question was asked: "What does a vestry do?" Indeed. What does a vestry do?

The simple, standard answer is that the vestry of an Episcopal Church looks after the finances, property and budget of the parish. That obligation, of course, comes with many offshoots, such as providing for a safe and secure space where everyone can worship and ministries can flourish.

There was big news on that front this week when St. Brendan's received a \$12,500 grant from the diocesan Growth Fund toward a \$20,000 package of security improvements that have been planned by the vestry. **Ever since the 2018 Tree of Life shooting in Pittsburgh and similar tragedies at other houses of worship (like the one in Minneapolis on Wednesday), St. Brendan's has worked to enhance its security measures.** One of the most notable was creation of the security stewards, a team of volunteers overseen by Tim Austin who unobtrusively patrol the property during Sunday services.

The newest security improvement will be the \$20,000 package that was in the works for months and given final approval by the vestry in July. When installed this fall, the upgrades will include electronic door locks on the main entrance and kitchen doors; replacement of metal keys with key codes to ensure that doors stay locked and key access is properly limited; and the application of bullet-resistant safety film to more of our windows. Our thanks go to Junior Warden Dan Moore of the vestry for shepherding this project through various contractors and competing bids. We're grateful also for Tim's persuasive application which secured the \$12,500 diocesan grant that will pay for nearly two-thirds of the project — no small feat.

That's good work all around, for the greater good of St. Brendan's.

Masking at St. Brendan's. As Mother Nancy wrote in a recent column and the vestry discussed at its July meeting, St. Brendan's has revised its masking policy. Instead of masking up at the 10 a.m. service on the first Sunday of the month, everyone is being asked to be mindful of our vulnerable parishioners at all times. That means considering wearing a mask on any day if you're recovering from a cough, cold or other respiratory illness. Masks will be available in three locations: the church entrance and on two tables in the rear of the sanctuary. Also, while mask-wearers are welcome to sit anywhere, St. Brendan's continues to offer a "safe zone" in the last two rows of seats on the left for any mask-wearers who feel more comfortable seated away from others. Please be considerate of our friends with health vulnerabilities who want to worship in person. Kindness counts.

The Discernment Committee wants to thank everyone who participated in our three recent Discussion Groups. In that process, we learned in greater detail about themes that the **Holy Cow!** survey revealed and we received wholly new suggestions that will enrich our work.

NOTE: We did discover that some folks are still unclear about the exact nature of the position we are looking to fill: **a full-time priest-in-charge**. Our parish is not yet ready to recruit a rector. **Rectors** are full-time priests who enjoy a form of ecclesiastical "tenure" in that their positions have no time limitation. **Priests-in-charge** can be full-time or part-time, but they all work on contracts that cover a set time period (usually three years). Rev. Smolko and Rev. Jarrell both worked part-time on such contracts; our new priest will be full-time.

At this point in our work, the Committee must frame the three documents that will launch our search for a new priest: (i) our Parish Profile, (ii) the Community Portfolio required by the national Church's Office of Transition Ministries, and (iii) our position announcement for the Episcopal Church news. We will work as quickly and efficiently as we can, but it will be several weeks before you hear from us again. Please be patient and keep us in your prayers at this pivotal time.
