The Priest's Corner

The Amazon: Our Lungs

You've likely heard me share that every Sunday night at 7:15 p.m. I talk to my mentor and spiritual guide. His name is John, and he's from California; we met at a spiritual convention in Houston almost 10 years ago. He is a professional dancer-owner of a ballroom — who taught Ken and me the box step so that we could have a meaningful first dance at our wedding. When he was visiting Pittsburgh once, we went to the Point and John conducted a water blessing of the three rivers. Creation seemed to affirm his priesthood as brightly colored insects alighted on his fingertips while Spirit blessed the waters through his hands. John taught me how to "tree hug," and I taught him how to handle staff members who triangulate and manipulate by using a managing technique called "When you ... I feel ... because ..." Our weekly conversations are robust, deep and all-encompassing. We feel connected for hundreds of years and rejoice that Spirit helped our paths cross.

John is an ordained Minister of Walking Prayer through the Center for Sacred Studies. He is an earth-based, interfaith, non-denominational minister. All of the Native American cultures believe that every action they take must take into consideration the next seven generations. John's walking prayer is based on this. John and I ministerially have different practices, emphases, dogmas and even vocabularies, but we have found spirit-unity because we acknowledge the same Higher Power who I just happen to call God and John calls Goddess.

John has taught me about the Amazon rain forest and alerted me to the following appeal on behalf of the Amazon River, our "world's lungs." Here is your and my chance for a daily concentrated global prayer-action for the Amazon. The opportunity is called: "12:11 EST Every Day."

Another earth-loving, climate-respecting individual, Rudy Randa, lives in the heart of the Amazon. He reports that where he lives near the Amazon River he is safe and the trees there are still lush and thriving. He goes on to explain that the fires that are raging across this world are a wake-up call, priming those who are unaware to come to awareness that we need to take care of this mesmerizing, stupendously gorgeous planet.

He tells us that it is important not to fall into fear or anger, noting that as someone who is on the front lines with these things it is often hard not to be angry as anger is not the solution. He confirms that many people are reaching out and asking how they can

help. Rudy presents many ways, but emphasizes the most important is for rain to come and halt the destruction of the forests. Many people question whether “thoughts and prayers” actually work. Rudy firmly believes they do. The power of collective thoughts and prayers is an insurmountable force that cannot be reckoned with. Let’s follow this global call. Here’s what those closest to the Amazon fires are asking us to do. So,

I, Regis, am asking that we at St. Brendan’s put this to the test. There is nothing to lose. Let us join the indigenous spiritual leaders of the Aniwa Community in praying silently for five minutes daily for rain to come and stop these Amazon fires. Every day at 11:11 a.m. Acre Brasil time (the Amazon) the Aniwa Community prays together and individually for rain for five minutes. Our five minutes will start at 12:11 p.m. each day. Would you set an alert on your cellphones so that you can join in at the same time as the world prays for rain on the Amazon?

There are hundreds of thousands of people globally already doing this communal prayer for rain. There have already been three days of unexpected rains in many regions of the Amazon. The goal is to get 100 million people concentrating on rain for the Amazon for five minutes each day.

Are you in? Let me or someone at St. Brendan’s know. This will build support for this global environmental connection. Share this with your relatives and friends. Share it on Facebook, Instagram and other social media. Consider making it a family activity. Look for more ideas and activities around St. Brendan’s calling attention to this worldwide effort to save our world’s lungs.

Sunday School Begins THIS Sunday, September 8

Sunday School both for LAMBS and FISH will begin on **September 8**. All classes are held during the 10 a.m. Sunday service. The children will be released to the classes from church after the opening song and greeting with a “commission” from Fr. Regis. They will return for communion.

All classes will use the WHIRL Lectionary curriculum – reading, reflecting on, and discussing the weekly Gospel reading. The children will meet together for a prayer and song. The children will then be broken into two groups: pre-K to 2nd grade and 3rd to 5th graders. The younger students will follow the Godly Play method for the Bible story presentations.

The two groups will work together seasonally on a service project and will plan and participate in the Children’s Liturgy, the fourth Sunday of the month. All children are welcome to participate in the Children’s Liturgy by singing, reading the Scriptures, leading the Prayers of the People, serving as ushers, etc.

Numerous experts have said the key to real political change is to get more citizens to register and to get them to the polls to vote. We, at St. Brendan's, want to do our part.

In the entrance to the church you will find voter registration forms. They have the mailing address for Allegheny County. There are a few without the address for those who may not live in the county. Please affix a first class stamp.

We are urging each parishioner to take three. When you are out to eat, ask your server if they are registered. Ask the clerk at the grocery store. Many service workers do not have the time to seek out a form and register. Ask your friends and neighbors, too.

If we all registered 3 people, we could make a real difference locally and even nationally.

October 7 is the deadline to be registered. Applications for an absentee ballot must be made by October 29. And Election Day is November 5.

We will also have information in the coming weeks on some registration drives at schools and local stores.

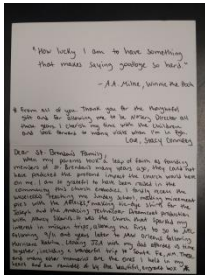

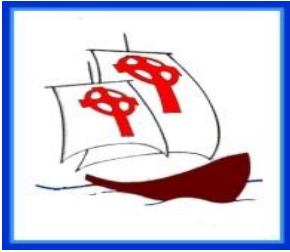
