Be careful what you wish for. In the church where I was raised, members would often grumble that they had no say in how parish funds were spent, no role in choosing their priest and no business overseeing operations of the parish. Thank goodness that's not the case in the Episcopal Church. But it comes with a price. The price is that lay people must expend the necessary time and energy to manage many aspects of their church. While the priest in any Episcopal parish is in charge of all matters regarding worship and spirituality, the vestry is elected by the congregation to handle the budget, property and general activities. Other lay members play a big part, too, and that's a good thing.

For now, though, let's focus on the vestry. St. Brendan's has nine vestry members, each of whom serves a three-year term. I don't know how other vestries are organized, but because St. Brendan's has so many ministries, each vestry member here has an area (or two) of oversight. This doesn't mean they personally perform that particular function, but they serve as a liaison to the parishioners who do lead or are involved in those activities. You'll find every vestry member listed next to their area of oversight in the Navigator's Log and Sunday bulletin.

For instance, Ruth Horton, the vestry member who oversees Outreach, doesn't run the outreach activities (Justice Ministry, CRIES Advocacy, English as a Second Language, etc.). Instead, she serves as a link between the vestry and the outreach leaders on projects they've taken on and resources they might need. Similarly, Sandy Nagy, the vestry member who oversees Audio-Visual Technology, doesn't run the equipment, but makes sure it's in working order and that St. Brendan's has the trained personnel to operate it.

If you're new to the Episcopal Church, you may be thinking what's up with those "wardens." The junior warden oversees the building and grounds and makes sure all is in working order. While Dan Moore has a wide range of DIY skills, he, as junior warden, is not the janitor, plumber or electrician — but he will certainly call one when necessary. Finally, there's the senior warden, the person who chairs the vestry and has oversight of all these overseers. As I said at the beginning, be careful what you wish for.
