## The Priest's Corner

### A Few Loose Ends

Last week we had a message from our former music director, who reflected on her 17 years of ministry. The previous week's Priest's Corner and the week before that ended with a promise to conclude some thoughts the following week, but other happenings to write about crept up and I had to shift gears. So today I'd like to complete the first of the last two Priest's Corners. Here goes:

Priest's Corner #110 was about children's presence at Liturgy. I was taking this notion through our three-stooled approach to authority and covered the Scriptural basis for children at Liturgy as well as the Tradition basis for their presence during liturgy. Today is the Reason basis for children at liturgy. This is the rational basis. You've likely heard the saying that the Episcopal Church encourages you not to "leave your brain at the door." Don't you just love this? I certainly do.

Here's the reason why children at liturgy makes sense. "Children bring adults!" So if you want your church to prosper and grow, children's presence will do that for you — if the children are valued and treated as the true gifts they are. I believe St. Brendan's does a fantastic job with children. We are getting between 15-30 children a week now, and we are responding beautifully. I think you know that if you want to experience a "come-to-Jesus" moment from me, just complain about the children. I've only experienced one complaint in my 3+ years at St. Brendan's. It was a forming complaint around a few years ago that was about to suggest that a parent had no control over a child. Before the complaint was fully out of the person's mouth, here was my response: "Tell me how you attempted to help the situation before I hear you out." No response! No ear lent!

Rather, this is what St. Brendan's is like with children — just one example. Almost 30 years ago a little boy by the name of Michael started growing up in St. Brendan's. His parents were very active in the church. Little Michael became known to almost all of the Brendanites of that day. His parents always knew he was in good hands when not in their immediate presence. Years later Michael, now a grown man, came to visit St. Brendan's with his fiancée. Several of the Brendanites took her aside and said to this soon-to-be bride, "Ask us anything you'd like about Michael — we raised him." This is in the DNA of St. B's.

Here's another "Reason" basis for children at St. Brendan's. They will never experience what one of our former "little ones" from years ago recently experienced. The parents are a same-sex couple. The little one was playing with a church friend who said

something to the effect that it was sad that this little one's parents "were going to hell." Upon investigation, this notion came from the friend's parents who picked that notion up at church. This kind of thing simply will never happen at St. Brendan's — the DNA of St. B's is incapable of producing such hatred. This seems to be a very reasonable "Reason" reason to have our presence of children at liturgy as we do.

Next week, if circumstances don't override it, I'll tie up the loose ends regarding sermon and verses of hymns as these relate to time in church. Happy Second Week of Advent. The theme of this week is Peace. May you have Peace all week long.

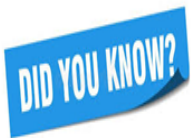

Our Peace Pole out front bears the message MAY PEACE PREVAIL ON EARTH in six languages which Pat Carnahan, our founding rector, selected as most representative of the peoples of the world. Out of 37 possibilities, she chose Arabic, Chinese, English, Hindi, Seneca and Spanish.

Lane Shadgett constructed a peace garden at the rear of our original building in 1992, as part of his Eagle Scout service project, donating the pole, stone benches and plants. The pole was moved to its present location following excavation for our new sanctuary.

The Peace Pole project was started in Japan in 1955 by the Society of Prayer for World and was dedicated to uplifting humankind toward harmony rather than conflict. There are thousands of peace poles in countries around the world. Ours was the third pole erected in the North Hills of Pittsburgh. The anchor in front of it was a gift from Norm Woods, a former member and retired Navy man.
