The Priest's Corner

Confirmations and Receptions on May 2 and a Bit About Our Garden

Bishop McConnell will be visiting St. Brendan's on May 2. This is an annual feature throughout the Episcopal Church. The bishop, as shepherd of the flock, comes to greet, spend time with and support each church in the diocese annually. The bishop also "confirms" those who want to claim the faith as their own and "receives" those who desire to become Episcopalians and/or align with the Episcopal practices, beliefs and social mores.

Julie has already gathered some adolescents for the Sacrament of Confirmation. I'd like to further extend the invitation to all adults or teens who have not yet been confirmed and feel some urging as this might feel like the year for such a commitment.

In addition to Confirmation, the Bishop will receive and welcome new committed Christians to the Episcopal Church. If you recall, it's been over two years since he was last able to do this. In that time, we've had eight adults ready to be received, but the Bishop was not available. When we discovered this, we asked Bishop McConnell if we could have the option to recognize those would-be reception candidates with a public declaration that they were one with St. Brendan's. He granted our request and almost a year ago, we held that ceremony at the church for seven members prior to the closing due to the pandemic; we also held one virtual ceremony later as part of a live streamed service. Now is the opportunity for all eight of those individuals to be present on May 2, either face-to-face or virtually, so that Bishop McConnell can formally receive them. (Invitations to do so will be coming to those folks soon.)

I suggested to the Bishop that we would likely have an additional cohort of individuals ready for reception this year. At the same time, though, we are restricting the return to in-person worship for safety reasons. So today we are announcing a new option: NOW THE GREAT NEWS! YOU WILL BE ABLE TO BE FORMALLY RECEIVED BY THE BISHOP VIRTUALLY, if you choose. I'll be sending invites to those I know are ready to take this step. If you choose to be received virtually, we will send you easy directions on how to do this. You'll just need to record yourself saying a few responses and praying a joint prayer. Then you'll send us the video as an attachment or upload it to a shared drive. It's truly simple—we will work out the details. Even mindful of the limited number of open, in-church seats available, many of you will likely be able to come to church and be received by the Bishop in real time. But you will have choices. We all just need to be respectful of the church's latest position on in-house worship as of May 2.

My sense is that we have in the ballpark of 10-12 people, in addition to the eight mentioned earlier, both prepared for and desirous of being received by the Bishop into the Episcopal Church. If you have any desire to be received, please let Regis or let Katie know as soon as possible.

This Little Log announcement is my first outreach to gather people for Reception. We will make announcements at church and through live streaming for the next two Sundays.

On another note, Ken and I will be taking some time away in Florida. If anyone would like to clean out the garden during the next two weeks, that would be greatly appreciated. We again received a \$500.00 grant for the garden. We need to add new Miracle Grow to the planting squares. If anyone wants to do that, contact Ken and he'll let you know how to go about doing that and get reimbursed for the purchase.

May Spring reawaken your energy and bring hope and joy as more restrictions are lifted and God opens up more flowers and color throughout our lives and landscapes. Happy Spring!

How do you fill a church?

In more than a year--since March 15, 2020--we have been busy filling our church. St. Brendan's has been filled with a presence not felt in all churches. But this is not something you measure by the number of people in the pews, but by the active presence of the Spirit among us.

When we first could not be together, we strode boldly into live streaming our services. Those of us who could be there were at first tentative but grew bolder in our togetherness and then supplemented our live readings and sermons with recorded readings and voices and music. We pinned images of our fellow Brendanites on our chairs and started the Saints of St. Brendan's video and the "Halle, Hallelujah." And we grew.

Then we added more images to the sermons, and more music in the service, and more and more people started participating by reading or singing. And the Spirit grew some more.

As our lives gradually opened a bit more and we started to move about, some of us moved away from Pittsburgh but remain as members of our choir and our congregation. And still, the presence of the Spirit in our church grew.

Then we started more study groups, more reading groups, more "Bible Lite" study sessions. More people came to Modern Episcopalians and our Spirit continued to grow.

Then we added speakers and forums and took up more social justice concerns and our presence in the broader community expanded. Some grew concerned about our message, and so we engaged our community and continued to take the message of loving our neighbors to our neighbors and neighborhoods wherever we are. And our church grew further.

Now we have a variety of zooming and calling and note writing and our Spirit spreads and we continue to grow. But as someone enjoying this Spirit filled time, I was missing people in the pews.

Until Easter Sunday.

What we experienced on Easter Sunday--the glorious day, the sun, the music, and the sermon--were all enriched because we had more people at church. Hearing the voices in church responding to collects, praying together, and sharing communion did give us a reminder of what we shall find, together, when this is over.

As Auden wrote at the very end of his Oratorio For the Time Being

He is the Way.

Follow Him through the land of Unlikeness;

You will see rare beasts, and have unique adventures

While I have not seen rare beasts, this last year has been a unique adventure. I have no doubt that St. Brendan's will not only survive but prove stronger as we move through and beyond this experience together. After all, we are St. Brendan's.

Mitch Bassi, a long-time volunteer from the Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank, will be speaking on how the Food Bank bridges communities and resources in our region to help our neighbors in need overcome food insecurities and lead healthy, happy lives.

Because of the pandemic, individuals and families who never imagined asking for a helping hand have turned to the Food Bank for the first time. People most vulnerable to food insecurity, such as people of color, veterans, people with disabilities, seniors and children need our support more than ever to ensure they have a steady source of fresh and healthy food.

We will be raising funds to assist the Food Bank in helping our brothers and sisters in need during this very difficult time. For every \$1.00 raised, the Food Bank is able to provide five meals to those in need. Our goal is \$5,000. When we reach our goal, the Food Bank will be able to provide 25,000 more meals!

St. Brendan's Scholarships. The parish invites young church members who will be enrolled in college, technical school or other post-secondary education in fall 2021 to apply for a St. Brendan's Scholarship. Grants are awarded on the basis of a person's years of participation and attendance in St. Brendan's services and activities. Guidelines and applications, which must be received by the church no later than Saturday, May 1, are available by contacting the office. Launched in 1996 by a parishioner, the late Dorsey Dodroe, the scholarship fund has awarded 76 grants to 29 students. The program is sustained by the generosity of St. Brendan's members, and donations may be made to the fund at any time.

Senior Warden's Corner

With the arrival of Eastertide, the rhythm of church life begins to return to "normal," and it is time to update you on a couple of more mundane developments that will allow St. Brendan's to sustain and grow its work in the coming months and years.

First, we have secured a \$500 grant from the Diocese to provide critical materials for this year's Garden of Hope. This family-friendly, outdoors ministry allows St. Brendan's to send fresh produce throughout the growing season to the North Hills Food Bank. They in turn distribute it to needy families in our area. For more details, see https://www.stbrendans.org/garden-of-hope.

Second, we were selected as one of 160 applicants across the state to receive a Non-Profit Security Grant of \$25,000. These funds will enable us to provide reliable cell phone coverage throughout the lower level of our building and to upgrade our fire alarm system to provide 24/7/365 coverage.

Third, we just submitted an additional grant proposal to the Episcopal Church's Beloved Community initiative. If approved, that award will allow us to extend the work of the Justice Committee in new and exciting directions.

Writing these proposals is hard work. Administering them once a grant is made is no picnic either! But these dollars will help us to continue key ministries without always relying on the pledge-supported operating budget that we approve each January. I am grateful to all those who have contributed—and it is a team effort—to planning, writing and submitting these proposals.

In that spirit, we invite you to mark the following important dates in your calendar:



Saturday, May 8 – The Ordination of Darrell Johnson to the Diaconate. COVID restrictions have resulted in recent ordinations being "Invitation Only" affairs, but live-streaming has been available via Trinity Cathedral's Facebook page. We will keep you updated on the arrangements as the date draws nearer.



Sunday, May 9 – Our 10:00 a.m. Eucharist will be Darrell's first service at St. Brendan's as a Permanent Deacon, and Fr. Regis has asked him to preach that day.



Saturday, May 15 (approx.) – The Diocesan Nominating Committee plans to announce the slate of candidates for Bishop. We expect to receive biographical information and perhaps short videos from the candidates.



Week of June 14-19 – "Meet and Greet Week." This will be our opportunity to meet the candidates (either in person or virtually) and to hear them speak about their own histories and about their understanding of our parish and our diocese.



Saturday, June 26 – The Electing Convention. St. Brendan's three deputies (Megan Overby, Joyce Donadee and Cameron Grosh) will be eligible to cast votes as laypersons; Fr. Regis and Pr. Julie will vote as members of the clergy.

These are certainly not the only important dates; we will be back with more in future Little Logs. But for now, they will give you a sense of how two of the important processes will unfold in the coming weeks.

Confirmation! In hopeful anticipation of the Bishop's visit on May 2, youth seeking to be confirmed need to begin the final preparation for their confirmation.

While the church is still not opened, we will meet via Zoom. Once the weather improves, I will try to have us together as we are able to be together. We will be using My Faith, My Life: A Teen's Guide to the Episcopal Church for our preparation.

Deciding upon confirmation is personal and is not age-based but a mark on a young person's faith journey. Do you think you are ready to affirm the promises made on your behalf in your baptism? Our preparation class is to explore what it means to be a child of God, a Christian and an Episcopalian.

CRIES Advocacy. (Christian Response In Emergency Situations). This week we are supporting the work of The Society of Saint John the Evangelist, an Episcopal religious community ministering through workshops, retreats, prayer and spiritual direction.



An upcoming milestone for one of our own: The announcement here, soon to be published in Grace Happens, marks a significant milestone for St. Brendan's own Darrell Johnson. Darrell's journey of discernment began in the fall of 2017 in conversations with Fr. Regis. In the spring of 2018 Dr. Jno Hunt chaired a Discernment Committee to examine Darrell's calling and make a recommendation to the Vestry. With the Discernment Committee's recommendation and the Vestry's approval, Darrell was nominated to Bishop McConnell as a postulant. In June of 2018 Darrell, now a postulant, began his seminary studies at Stevenson School for Ministry in Harrisburg, PA. Darrell completed his academic studies in November 2020. On October 31, 2020 Bishop McConnell named Darrell a candidate for ordination, following our Vestry's approval and recommendation. On March 25, 2021 the diocesan Commission on Ministry recommended Darrell's ordination to the Standing Committee. With the Standing

Committee's certification, Bishop McConnell confirmed Darrell's ordination and Darrell took the final step in the formation process, becoming an ordinand. The journey from nominee to postulant, from postulant to candidate, and from candidate to ordinand is complex and lengthy. Behind the scenes, a significant number of Brendanites have been involved in Darrell's journey in one way or another. Thanks to all those who have supported Darrell in his journey!

Due to the constraints of St. Paul's pandemic protocols, attendance is limited and by invitation only; however, the service will be available for everyone via Facebook streaming. That link will be communicated as we get closer to the date. Be looking for that in a future Little Log.

VOTING BY MAIL 2021! Last November, 2.6 MILLION Pennsylvanians cast their ballots by mail, safely and securely from home.



If you applied to vote by mail last year and signed up for the "permanent" vote-by-mail list, and you want to automatically receive ballots for this year's elections, you must sign up again for 2021, since this list is only on an annual basis. You can fill out the application that was mailed to you and return it to your county board of elections, or complete one online here.

It takes just a few minutes to sign up to get both your mail-in ballots for 2021. Your county will keep you updated as your ballots are processed, printed, mailed to you, and returned. If you didn't register for the "permanent" list last year, but are interested in joining, you can read more here and sign up using the same online form.

Voters should request their mail-in ballot **before May 11, 2021** to make sure they have time to receive their secure ballot and return it in time. If you're signing up to vote by mail online, just make sure you're registered to vote beforehand and have either your PA driver's license number or social security number handy.

Please make sure your friends and family are aware of this! Thank you for being a voter.



The Haitian project. We want to fill two school buses so that they can be transported to Haiti both within the same month. One bus is filled to the brim but we can still use more clothes, shoes and other items to fill the second bus. Children's clothing, women's size 14 and smaller, men's shirts up to size extra large, men's pants up to waist 34 are utilized by Haitian people who tend to be smaller than Americans. They also can use donations of
