The Priest's Corner

Prayer Waiting

My all-time favorite preacher was The Rev. Will B. Dunn, a character created by the late Doug Marlette for his Kudzu comic strip. Will was no ordinary preacher, mind you. He was with it, always up to date, in tune with the signs of the times. He also had a way of commenting not only on the signs of the times in general but on organized religion in particular. I miss him.

An example: Will is on his knees praying. He only got on his knees when he was desperate, otherwise he assumed God would take care of him, preacher of the Word of God that he was. Will begs: "Lord, I beseech thee...Grant me..." But he is interrupted by a "click, click" "Uh, sure, I can hold" he says. Then with a scowl on his face, he says, "I hate prayer waiting."

Don't we all? I mean, when I am at prayer, I want God's undivided attention. And, more importantly, I want a response right now: no prayer waiting and no answer-prayer waiting for me. But wait I must, must we all. God always hears our prayers. We know that. We always have God's undivided attention. Whether or not God has our undivided attention when God is trying to get God's message across to us is another matter, maybe an even more important matter, but always another matter when Item One on our agenda is Prayer Answered.

God knows our needs even before we ask. God even knows our wants. What God wants, I think, is for us to recognize those needs, distinguish them from our wants, and then reflect on what we will do to help fulfill those needs, Most of the time God allows us to take care of those needs on our own. God simply gives us the grace to recognize the need from the want and the strength to do our part.

But our prayers are always answered. They are not always answered in the manner or the means we would like. But they are answered. God never leaves us hanging forever: for a while, perhaps, but not forever. My suspicion is that the time between making our needs known to God and God's response is to be used by us to do what we can do to respond to those needs.

When we have done all that we can do, at least our doing our part, God will do God's part, but not before. When those in real need came to Jesus, they knew they had a need – to see, to walk, to be healed in one way or another. They had done all they could. Now they were putting the rest into God's, God's Son's hands.

Prayer waiting just might be an apt way to describe prayer. We need to wait a while, take time to get in touch with ourselves so that we can wait on God. Maybe one of the reasons why it seems that it takes so long for God to get around to us is that we don't give God the time to get to us.

Update on Preparations for Vestry Elections this Sunday

At the Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday, we will elect new vestry members, as Janice Moore, Larry Toler and Tim Austin complete their three-year terms. Our Bylaws lay out a process for developing a slate of nominees that the parish then votes on. Nominations from the floor are also in order, though the Bylaws require "that [each] nominee has previously indicated that he or she will serve if elected."

This year, our Nominating Committee has identified two candidates who are willing to serve if elected and who, in our view, will serve St. Brendan's well: John Appledorn and Kate Heston. A photo and brief biographical sketch of each person appears below.

However, we have been unsuccessful in finding a third nominee. On Sunday, therefore, after the Nominating Committee proposes Kate and John for election, we will ask if there are any further nominations. If one or more additional names are brought forward (and if those individuals meet the "willingness to serve" criterion), we can proceed to the election. If nobody else is nominated, we will still move ahead, but this will result in our having an eight-member vestry for 2022. While not the norm for St. Brendan's, this outcome would still be consistent with our Bylaws, which state that "the vestry shall consist of not more than nine nor less than seven members."

Candidates



John Appledorn

I was born and raised in Kentucky. I first came to Pennsylvania when I entered the seminary in 1961 to study for the Roman Catholic priesthood. I became a member of the Capuchin Franciscan order in 1967 and was ordained a priest in 1974. During my years as a priest, I served as a seminary instructor, spiritual director and hospital chaplain. I chose to leave the priesthood in 1989 as I found myself increasingly at odds with various teachings and positions of the Catholic Church.

I earned my Master's degree in counseling from Loyola College in Baltimore in 1981. Upon leaving the priesthood I began working in the field of substance abuse treatment. Over the next 29 years I worked as a counselor and administrator in two different agencies. I retired in 2018.

I first came to St. Brendan's in 2019 at the invitation of Fr. Regis, who I have known for many years. I was immediately welcomed and felt drawn to the Episcopal Church, which I found to be more in line with my own beliefs. I was received by the Bishop in 2020. Over the past three years I have become increasingly involved in the many activities of St. Brendan's. I currently volunteer as a greeter, usher and lector and participate in two Bible Study groups and one of the Modern Episcopalian groups.



Kate Heston

I have been attending St. Brendan's since I moved to Wexford in Fall 2017. I usually attend the 10:00 service, although occasionally I will join the 8:00 folks. I sang with the choir for several years and I have volunteered in other capacities throughout my time at St. Brendan's. More recently, you may have seen me serving as a greeter, usher, and reader.

I was raised in the United Methodist Church. My father was a United Methodist minister and served several churches in Western Pennsylvania, including Bethany United Methodist in Latrobe, PA, where I graduated high school. I attended Lock Haven University of PA and then worked in Admissions for Lock Haven for 9 years. In 2004 I left Lock Haven to become the Director of Admission for Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ which later became Westminster College of the Arts of Rider University. I was there for almost 12 years. During my time in New Jersey, I joined and became a very active member of St. Philip's Church in New Hope, PA. St. Philip's was a small but mighty parish that was, and still is, very involved in social justice and service. I was on the vestry at St. P's and for many years I baked all the bread for communion.

I returned to Western PA in 2016 to be closer to my family. I met my husband Keith, and we were married in June 2018. I am currently the Associate Director of Music Admission and Student Services for the School of Music at Carnegie Mellon University. Along with all the admission, application, and audition activities for prospective students to the School of Music, I am the academic advisor for all the School of Music graduate students and non-music majors who have declared a music minor. Keith is retired and I plan to retire too sometime in the next few years. My position is ¾ time and I enjoy spending my free time baking, playing games, traveling (when safe), and spending time with family and friends.

I look forward to serving on Vestry and becoming even more involved in the life of St. Brendan's.

Children's Corner



“There's no place like home” ~ Dorothy ~ *The Wizard of Oz*

What a silly way to start the Children's Corner, but if you have ever seen the movie, *The Wizard of Oz*, you know Dorothy is trying to return home. The home she is trying to return to is her safe place. The place people know her and love her. Where her Auntie Em and Uncle Henry take care of her when she is ill and protect her from storms. All kinds of storms – weather storms like tornados, personality storms like Miss Gulch taking Toto, and personal ones like feeling alone and lost.

When I feel lost and alone, I go home too. I return to those people who know me best and love me no matter what. Just like Dorothy, we seek those who will give us a welcoming hug, listen to our woes, and comfort us. I know I am lucky that I have a big family and each of them loves me and listens to me. Then they tell me what they think I should do. They don't just accept everything I've done; they also tell me when I'm wrong and sometimes how to correct the wrong things I've done.

In this week's readings, we have Jesus returning home – maybe he was looking for comfort and wanted to return to those who knew him best and loved him. On the Sabbath Day, he attended religious services and was the reader. The rabbi asked him to give a sermon on the lesson and as we heard his sermon was "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." WOW! I hope there was a little more to that sermon. Because we also hear, "All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth."

But then they said, hey wait, "Is not this Joseph's son?" And what that means is they think his head is getting too big and he may be thinking too much about himself. They all knew him as a little boy, and now he's saying he's the Son of God? They ask themselves how can this be ~ that a man have two fathers ~ Joseph who raised him here with us and God? And they got mad at Jesus.

They got so mad at Jesus they pushed him out of the synagogue and almost threw him over a cliff. But the Psalm for this week lets us know Jesus will be protected, because Jesus knew that "God would protect him from the hands of the wicked."

Our reading this week also reminds us that if we love someone, we treat them with respect and kindness. That we should be patient with those we love. Because "love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends."

Senior Warden's Corner

A little over two years ago, St. Brendan's was facing a challenge. This was one of life's better challenges, a challenge that grew out of all that we love most about our community of faith. At our 10:00 a.m. Eucharists, the exchange of the Peace was lasting for so long that even Fr. Regis felt we needed a way to bring it to an orderly close and move on to the Holy Communion itself. As it happened, Daniel May had just taken over as our Music Director and suggested that an upbeat Caribbean-inspired setting of Halle, Halle, Hallelujah! might offer an elegant solution. Brendanites quickly embraced this as an ideal segue from the informality of the Peace back to the heart of our Eucharistic celebrations. Problem solved.

But only a few weeks later, the pandemic arrived on the scene—and our services went online. Daniel, Sean and Cameron teamed up to figure out what this might mean for our worship and, as part of this re-imagining, devised the online version of Halle, Halle, Hallelujah! with which we are now so familiar. For many of us, this was to serve as a bright flame in a dark world, giving musical voice to the triumphant lines from the funeral service in our Book of Common Prayer, “even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.” The array of happy faces on the screen, the joyful harmonizations and even the shouts of congratulation at its close reminded us of who we were and why we were worshipping together.

The pandemic is still with us, alas, but at the most recent meeting of the Worship Committee (and almost exactly two years after the Halle, Halle, Hallelujah! made its first appearance) we decided that this contribution to our liturgies had served its purpose and deserved to be retired—at least as a routine part of the service. Don't worry, though: the Saints of St. Brendan's slide show that precedes each 10:00 service will continue, reminding us of our friends whom we see far less often than any of us would wish. And Daniel and others will undoubtedly find new ways to celebrate our common life of worship in music.

And so we will move forward again as God's people in Franklin Park—Alleluia indeed!

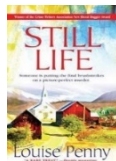

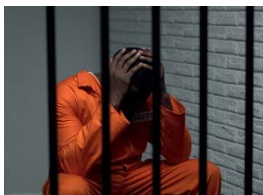
