# **Children's Corner**




## **Happy Trinity Sunday**

Do you know what the Trinity is? Can you explain the trinity to someone? These are the really big questions that we wrestle with in church.

We know God – the Creator, also referred to as Father. And we know Jesus, he is our Redeemer and the Son. Last week, we heard about the Spirit. And of the three, the Holy Spirit is the least mentioned, the least understood but I think is the most present with us. I like to think of the Spirit as that cool breeze that

strokes our cheeks on a hot day, or that breath of fresh air in the spring will the scent of flowers, or blast of comforting warm air when you enter the house when it is cold outside. See, even my examples come in threes.

So what is the Trinity? Tri means three so we know there are three parts, and when we sing our hymn "Holy, Holy, Holy" it tells us – "God in three persons, blessed Trinity." So obviously Pastor Julie, the Trinity is the three parts of the Trinity. And the answer is yes, but then what is God? Part of the Trinity or all of the Trinity together? And you see how quickly this becomes complicated.





Look around and see how often you see three interlocking circles or images. We use these in church to try to show what the trinity is, to try to make something really hard to understand, easier for all of us to get.

I think this is why St. Patrick used a shamrock – each part is part of the shamrock and together it is the shamrock, so the shamrock is a great example of THE trinity.

But I think an even easier way for us to understand the trinity is to think of love. Think of all the love in your life. We love our parents, we love our siblings, our pets and our friends. As we get older, we fall in love with other people and make new families. And as we get older, we realize we love some people one way, and other people other ways. For example, we love our mothers in a special way and that love is a bit different than how we might love our brothers and sisters. And that is a bit different than how we love our friends or our spouse. And why I think this is like the trinity is because it is all love. Different kinds of love but each one is love and together it is all love.

And – it is all
...just
....love.

# Senior Warden's Corner

For St. Brendan's, as for the nation as a whole, the process of emerging from fifteen months of COVID restrictions has been—what shall we say—hesitant? cautious? uneven? Sudden shifts in CDC policy have led to clergy discussions and prompted statements by Bishop McConnell, all at a pace that made it hard to know how often to send out announcements about changes at the parish level. If at certain points that left some of you with questions unanswered, I apologize.

At this point, however, it is appropriate to clarify where matters stand.

- No reservations are now required to attend our Sunday services at either 8:00 or 10:00.
- We continue to ask that children under 12 not attend services just yet. At this month's Vestry Meeting, Pr. Julie presented a detailed plan for re-introducing children to church over the course of the summer; she will share more information about that program soon. (NOTE: The Parish Picnic is an exception to this policy; the kids are welcome to join us there.)
- Masks are still required in church and we will continue to seat people with an eye to distancing, though the minimum distance will be reduced. We hope soon to have ushers back in the building to assist with this task.
- Congregational singing is now permitted but you must not remove your mask in order to sing.
- If COVID numbers continue to improve (vaccinations ↑ new cases ↓), we plan to introduce a simple Coffee Hour (hopefully outdoors) in July.
